• 21 partners from 11 countries








Through the governmental initiative, the Central and Eastern European (CEE) countries set the vision for 2030:

# National platforms for bioeconomy strategy development



The main driving force of the national platforms for bioeconomy development are the inter-ministerial groups (BAIMG) and the national stakeholder (NSG)

different approaches: in Estonia there will be one group only as the number of stakeholders is limited and they can be involved directly in the BAIMG and discuss all topics; in the Czech Republic, a BIO Hub has been established; in Bulgaria, mirror groups to the BIOEAST TWGs have been created.

**INDUSTRIAL STAKEHOLDERS:** The target groups are those farmers, cooperatives, start-ups, SMEs, non-for profit companies, clusters, business associations, big industrial players, which do wish to gain general knowledge about bioeconomy related business models, sustainable biomass valorization, and modern biorefinery concepts.

**RURAL FACILITATORS:** The target groups are those advisors, bioeconomy related clusters or consultancies, business associations, who can facilitate and mobilize the bioeconomy related stakeholders to turn to bioeconomy and to utilize unused biomass or to implement an idea related to bioeconomy. The training helps them in shaping bioeconomy value chains.

Furthermore, those who are interested in Horizon Europe calls and are open to collaborating with different types of actors in the implementation of a bioeconomy related project.

## BIOEAST Thematic Working groups (TWGs) EAST SUP

TWGs are operating within the **BIOEAST Initiative** as a lasting macro-regional thematic network, represented by nationally nominated representatives of ministries, academia and industry.

The topics of the TWGs reflect the macro-region's key BE sectors:

- (i) Freshwater-based Bioeconomy,
- (ii) Agroecology and Sustainable Yields,
- (iii) Food Systems,
- (iv) Bioenergy and Bio-based Materials and
- (v) Forestry Value Chain.





The role of the Advisory Council is to **provide expert opinions** for the BIOEAST Board which consists mostly of policy makers.

## Foresight Exercise



A macro-regional BIOEAST Foresight Exercise is being conducted to support the BIOEAST member states in developing their sustainable bioeconomies.

Five, high-level independent CEE experts have been selected by the BIOEAST Board.

The experts and ultimately the BIOEAST Foresight report shall look into the future perspectives of the macro region's bioeconomies (2030 – 2050), at the same time setting it in the wider EU and global context, investigating the special characteristics of the macro-regional bioeconomy deployment, special needs and potential with possible scenarios. Foresight report aims to raise awareness about current and future challenges for the national policy developments, to improve the policy framework to address long-term challenges, and to provide basis for the BIOEAST Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA) development.

# BIOEAST- Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda



- A framework was created that guides the development of BIOEAST SRIA as well as thematic SRIAs developed by TWGs.
- Desk study to map the research and innovation policy as well as the state of the art of bioeconomy related research and innovation in all BIOEAST countries is being conducted
- In coming months BIOEASTsUP partners in collaboration with NCPs will conduct a series
  of workshops in all BIOEAST countries to engage national BAIMGs and NSGs in the
  analysis of strengths, weaknesses, threats and opportunities as well as gaps in
  bioeconomy related research and innovation.
